Rules of Decorum

*"Members of the Public are advised that all **ELECTRONIC DEVICES, CELLULAR TELEPHONES and any OTHER COMMUNICATION DEVICES** are to be turned off upon entering the City Council Chambers." If you need to have a discussion with someone in the audience, kindly step out into the lobby.*

Under the Government Code, the City Council may regulate disruptive behavior that impedes or delays the City Council Meeting.

Disruptive conduct may include, but is not limited to:

- Screaming or yelling during another audience member's public comments period;
- Profane language directed at individuals in the meeting room;
- Throwing objects at other individuals in the meeting room;
- Physical or verbal altercations with other individuals in the meeting room; and
- Going beyond the allotted three-minute public comment period granted.
- Leaving your chosen seat during the meeting to either visit or film.

When a person's or group's conduct disrupts the meeting, the Mayor will request that the person or group stop the disruptive behavior, and WARN the person or group that they will be asked to leave the meeting room if the behavior continues.

If the person or group refuses to stop the disruptive behavior, the Mayor may order the person or group to leave the meeting room, and may request that those persons be escorted from the meeting room.

It should also be noted that any person who WILLFULLY disturbs or interrupts the City Council meeting may be arrested for a misdemeanor offense. (*Penal Code Section 403*).

Reglas de Comportamiento

“Al público en general se le avisa que todos los teléfonos celulares, pagers y demás aparatos de comunicación deben ser apagados al entrar a la sala de audiencias del Consejo Municipal de la Ciudad.” Si usted necesita tener una conversación con alguien que está en la audiencia, amablemente le pedimos que salga del recinto y tenga su conversación en el vestíbulo de la sala de audiencias.

Bajo el Código de Gobierno, el Consejo Municipal de la Ciudad tiene la autoridad de regular conducta que perturbe, impida o retrase la reunión del Consejo Municipal de la Ciudad.

Conducta inapropiada o perturbadora puede incluir, pero no está limitada a:

- Gritar mientras otro miembro del público o Concejal tenga la palabra;
- Lenguaje vulgar dirigido a otros individuos presentes en la sala de audiencias;
- Lanzarle objetos a otros individuos presentes en la sala de audiencias;
- Altercados físicos o verbales con otros individuos en la sala de audiencias; y
- Pasarse de los tres minutos asignados para el período de comentarios públicos.

Cuando la conducta de una persona o grupo perturbe la reunión, el Alcalde le pedirá a esa persona o grupo que pare el comportamiento perturbador, y le advertirá a esta persona o grupo que tendrá que abandonar la reunión si la conducta perturbadora persiste.

Si la persona o grupo se rehúsa a detener la conducta perturbadora, el Alcalde le puede ordenar a esta persona o grupo a que abandone la sala de audiencias, y puede solicitar que estas personas sean escoltadas fuera de la sala de audiencias.

También se debe hacer notar que una persona que altere o interrumpa la reunión del Consejo de la Ciudad con toda intención puede ser arrestada por una ofensa menor. (*Código Penal § 403*)
